About the Scholarship

Under Idaho State Code, the Idaho Grape Growers and Wine Producers Commission is charged with encouraging the planting and development of native vineyards and the production of wines from grapes, fruits and berries grown in Idaho. The Idaho Wine Education Scholarship will further that goal by assisting with the education of individuals interested in Idaho viticulture and enology. It is the Commission's hope that in turn, selected applicants will use the knowledge obtained to participate in the growth of the Idaho wine industry.

Any Idaho residents with a desire to obtain education to further a passion for viticulture and enology in Idaho is encouraged to apply. Each year, one to two individuals will be selected as the recipient(s) of the Idaho Wine Education Scholarship.

The Idaho Wine Education Scholarship may be used to further the recipient's education in viticulture and enology by means of a trade school, or 4-year accredited college. The use of the scholarship funds must be in relation to viticulture or enology in some aspect. Some examples also include Washington State University viticulture/enology certificate programs, Walla Walla Community College viticulture/enology programs.

Selection Process

Applicants will be selected on the basis of outstanding community service, achievement in academic and volunteer roles, demonstrated leadership, and interest in a career in Idaho viticulture or enology. Finalists will be notified by the Commission when the application has been reviewed.

Who's Eligible?

Idaho residents with a passion for pursuing a career in viticulture and enology who intend to work in Idaho's wine industry.

Idaho Wine Education Scholarship Recipients Will Have:

- Outstanding achievement in volunteer and leadership roles
- Community involvement
- Demonstrated leadership qualities
- Served as a role model
- Interest in wine and viticulture

- Include 2 letters of recommendation
- Submit at least one month prior to educational opportunity
