# **Legislative Report**

# **Roger Batt**

The 2025 Legislative Session continues to roll along. There is speculation that the Session will go into the first week of April. The Joint Finance and Appropriations Committee continues to set budgets. One of those budgets set last week was for the Idaho Department of Water Resources. Included in the IDWR budget was a \$30 million ongoing funding line item to support statewide water infrastructure and recharge. All of the regional and statewide water organizations supported this effort. The budget passed out of JFAC 15-5.

The Idaho Grape and Wine Commission successfully gave its annual presentation to the Senate and House Agricultural Affairs Committees. During those presentations, we specifically mentioned the need for a viticulturist at the Parma Research and Extension Center. During the Session the Commission worked with the U of I CALS folks to try to get this position approved through JFAC. A couple of weeks ago JFAC did not vote to support the new position. Some of the reasons included it being a very tight year for funds, the need to support the CAFE budget for the U of I (the University had to choose which budget to support), and some not agreeing with Wine being produced in Idaho. The good news is we have another year to host tours, educate about the industry, and help line things up for the 2026 Session.

S1133aaS passed the Senate last Friday. This legislation fixes some issues in the Agricultural Protection Area Act as a result of County ordinances that were passed in 2024 that restrict farmers from being able to apply for an APA. The Commission is one of the supporters of this Legislation. We anticipate a hearing on Thursday of this week in the House Local Government Committee.

S1033 regarding amendments to Idaho's Right to Farm Act is currently on the 3rd Reading calendar on the House Floor. This Legislation requires attorney's fees to go to a farming operation if someone files a frivolous case. It also sets up penalties for people who continue to harass farming operations with nuisance claims if those nuisance claims are not valid. The Commission is one of the supporters of this Legislation.

S1150 Water Bill - drip irrigation on a farm, small infrastructure on a farm, growers can apply for funding through local water conservation district; additional one million dollars for this currently.
