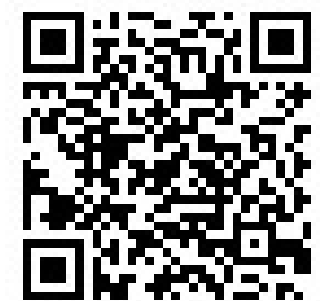

### THESE ARE KNOWN AS LICENSE ENDORSEMENTS. WHAT DO THEY MEAN?? HERE YA GO:

- **Brewer** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1001(b) brewer means a person licensed to manufacture beer inside or outside of the state of Idaho. A brewer in possession of a wholesaler license, may sell and or distribute their own product but must also possess a retailer license in order to sell any other alcohol products.
- **Wholesaler** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1001(m) means any person licensed to sell beer to retailers, wholesalers, permittees or consumers and to distribute beer from warehouse premises physically located within the state of Idaho described in the license. **This is applicable to wineries.** Every wholesale licensee is authorized to distribute any alcohol product.
- **Dealer** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1001(f) dealer means a person licensed to import beer into this state for sale to a wholesaler.
- **Winery** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1303(t) winery means a place, premises or establishment within the state of Idaho for the manufacture or bottling of table wine or dessert wine for sale. A winery in possession of a wholesaler license, may sell and or distribute their own product but must also possess a retailer license in order to sell any other alcohol products. **EXAMPLE:** Winery A who possess a wholesale license wants to sell beer on site. They **MUST** possess a retailer license.
- **Importer** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1303(g) an importer means a person to whom a wine importer's license has been issued. With this indorsement, a winery is authorized to import wine. Example: A winery in Idaho with a Z license whose production is in another state, may import their own product into the state of Idaho without going through a licensed distributor.
- **Distributor** - Per Idaho State Code 23-1303(e) a distributor means a person to whom a wine distributor's license has been issued. With this indorsement, a winery owner could distribute their own wine product.
- **In-State Direct Shipper** - Any Idaho-licensed winery (under 23-1306) or out-of-state winery with a wine direct shipper permit may sell and ship up to twenty-four (24) nine-liter cases of wine annually directly to an Idaho resident, age 21 or older, for personal use only (not for resale).
- **Wine Warehouse:** Per Idaho State Code 23-1303(a) means a licensed warehouse within the state of Idaho that is solely authorized to store and handle wine
- **Kegs to go** - allows for the sale of kegs of wine off premises.
